

The school is unified in strategic planning to see clearly who we are and where we are going.

Our facilities have been recently updated in a myriad of ways. The middle school received new lockers, fresh paint, and beautiful murals. New cafeteria floors, additional auditorium chairs, and much-needed repairs across all campuses were completed over the summer. The board boldly pressed forward with an investment in a gym renovation after much planning and deliberation, adding seats and amenities that set a new standard of quality for our players, students, and spectators to enjoy.

Mars Hill's greatest measure of success is the outcomes and achievements of our students. Last year, our senior class was awarded over 4 million dollars in scholarships from outstanding universities. Our overall ACT scores averaged 23% higher than the state average, and students are finding their place in prestigious collegiate programs. Our academic offerings have expanded with courses such as Greek, Physics, Dual Enrollment Biology, and Western Civilization, just to name a few.

We have seized opportunities to strengthen and support the safety of our students by adding more critical infrastructure and partnering with the Florence Police Department. We have also expanded support for our students' mental health by establishing a counseling department with additional resources and personnel.

Our athletic program is recognized as the best in the state, with multiple sports achieving state championships and our teams competing at the highest levels. Go Panthers! We look forward to seeing even greater success in all areas of the school: spiritual growth, leadership, academics, arts, student life, and much more.


Mars Hill has been blessed with so many who truly prioritize Christ, care for children, and champion educational excellence. With this foundation, we move forward at light speed.

12,000-FOOT EARLY EDUCATION WING OPENED FALL 2024

Over the past five years, our elementary programs have experienced significant enrollment growth, with interest continuing to rise. At the same time, our preschool programs have continued to maintain extensive waiting lists. To meet these needs, a 12,000-square-foot early education addition opened last fall. This new wing features six preschool classrooms, five elementary classrooms, and administrative offices. One of the many benefits of this expanded capacity to serve young learners has been the addition of two new Transitional Kindergarten classes beginning in fall 2025–26.



PARTNERSHIP WITH FLORENCE POLICE DEPARTMENT

In today's tumultuous times, the safety of our students is a top priority. To address needs in this area, the 2024-25 brought two major changes. First, a FEMA grant allowed for the upgrade of campus notification, surveillance, and access systems. These systems will enable enhanced security measures and faster response times in case of an emergency situation. Second, a partnership with the Florence Police Department brought a daily police presence and the friendly face of an SRO to campus. These officers have gone above and beyond to help our students feel safe, secure, and loved.


Alumni of the Year CLASS OF 1969

At MHBS, academic achievement continues to soar. In 2024–25, the very first graduating class to complete diploma tracks set the bar high-72% earned honors distinctions, and 14 seniors achieved the coveted Larimore Honors Diploma, the school's highest academic recognition. The coming year brings even more opportunities for students to thrive with fresh F Block courses in ACT Prep, Debate, Robotics, and Shoals History, alongside a new fine arts option in Creative Writing.

Did you know? Seven out of ten MHBS faculty members hold a Master's degree, and another 15% of faculty members and administrators have completed or are pursuing advanced postmaster's or doctoral studies.

In 2024-25, Mars Hill students participated in over 25 outstanding performances. Every TK-8th grade student engages in the arts daily as a part of their core curriculum, and nearly half of high school students continue to actively participate in the arts. At MHBS, the arts are more than an extracurricular - they cultivate talent, build confidence, and celebrate the God-given creativity in every student.













STUDENT ATHLETES EXCEL ACROSS DISCIPLINES

The 2024-25 school year once again showcased the extraordinary depth and consistency of Panther athletics. Across every sport, MHBS teams demonstrated the discipline, grit, and excellence that have become hallmarks of our program. Football, baseball, basketball, cross country, soccer, softball, volleyball, and track all advanced deep into postseason play and meets, with multiple teams earning Final Four appearances and several athletes claiming individual titles in addition to two state championship and two runner-up titles. Panther athletes embodied strength, teamwork, and perseverance, continuing the tradition of excellence that defines Mars Hill athletics.


